Dear Church,

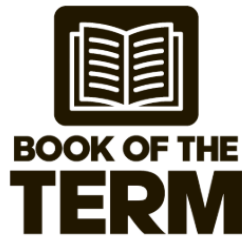

What part does he play in salvation and in our lives? How should we expect to see evidence of his work among us at WBC?

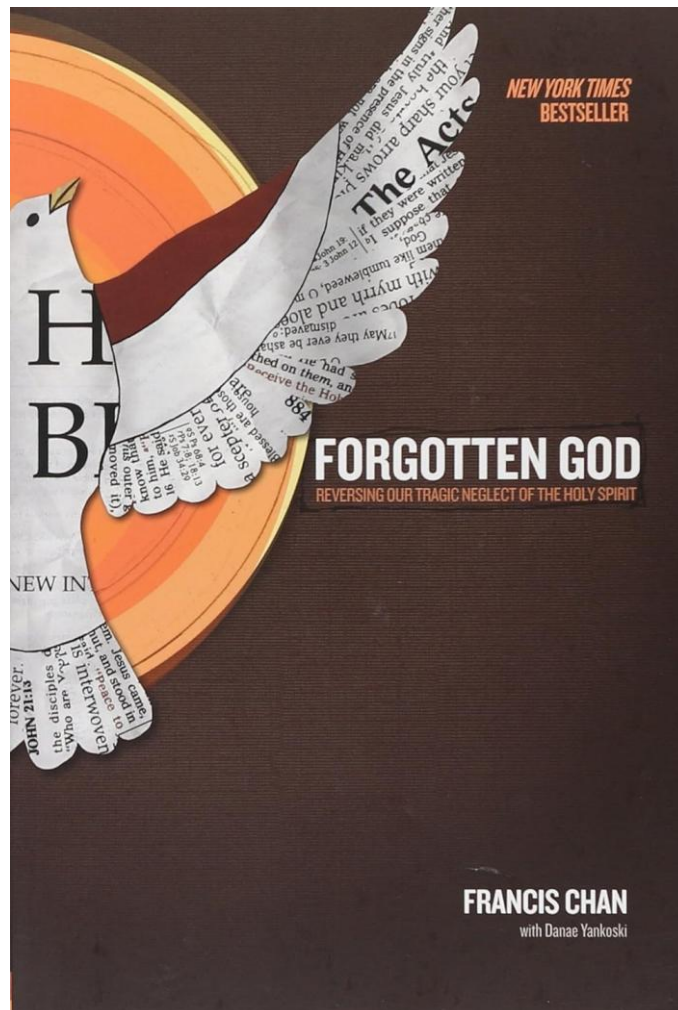

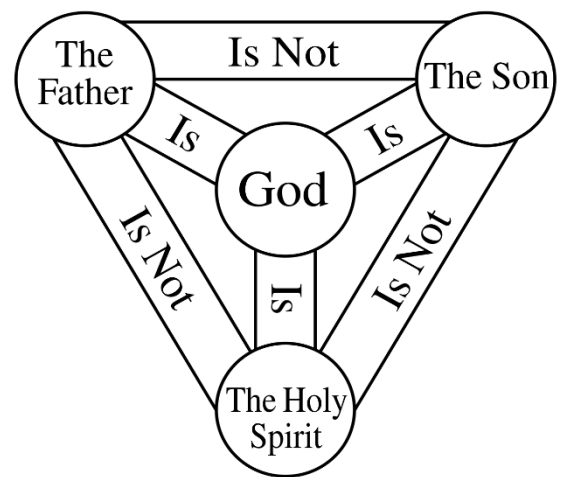


In *Forgotten God*, Francis Chan challenges readers to consider whether the Holy Spirit is truly at work in their lives or whether he has perhaps become a neglected part of their faith. Grounded in Scripture, he explores the Spirit's role in empowering believers to know God more deeply, grow in holiness, and participate in God's mission.

THE HOLY SPIRIT WITHIN THE TRINITY

A fundamental truth of the Christian faith is that the God we worship is three in one. There is no adequate analogy we can use to help us understand this truth, but God communicates it to us through his word and asks that we believe. In Matthew 28:19 Jesus commands his disciples to baptise in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, and Deuteronomy 6:4 says, “Hear, O Israel: the LORD our God the LORD is one.” God is three persons in one being: Father, Son and Spirit.

While sharing the same divine essence and participating in some of the same actions (such as creation), the three persons also play distinct parts in the great plan of salvation. It’s easy enough for us to grasp something of the Father and the Son, because we see that relationship represented in human families. In Scripture we see that the Father sends the Son and the Son dies to pay for our sin and rises as our eternal king. But what about the Holy Spirit?



Simply put, the Holy Spirit’s role is to glorify Christ (John 16:14). As we delve into the Bible throughout this series we’re going to see just how he does this: by living and working in the hearts of believers, helping us to understand God's word, making us more like Christ, equipping us for service, and assuring us that we belong to God. He is not an impersonal force or influence, but the third person of the Trinity, truly God and worthy of the same honour, praise and worship as the Father and the Son.

THE HOLY SPIRIT THROUGHOUT THE BIBLE

The word for “spirit” (*ruach* in the Hebrew Old Testament and *pneuma* in Greek New Testament) can be translated as “wind”, “breath” or “spirit”. This can lead us to think of him as a *part* of God, as something like divine breath. But throughout the Bible, we see that God’s Spirit *is* God himself, his presence among and within his people as he guides and teaches them to follow his ways.

The Holy Spirit is there throughout the story of Scripture, revealing God's active presence, power, and work in creation and redemption. In the Old Testament, he’s there at the beginning, hovering over the waters of creation (Genesis 1:2). He empowers his people to do his work (Exodus 31:1-5; Numbers 11:16-17), inspires divine words spoken through the prophets (Micah 3:8; Isaiah 48:16), and comes upon leaders and kings to guide them as they lead the people (Judges 6:34; 1 Samuel 16:13). His presence is everywhere (Psalm 139:7-12), he acts to bring supernatural strength (Judges 14:5-6) and new life (Ez 37:1-14).

On top of all of this, the Old Testament also makes promises about the future regarding God’s Spirit. First, that he will rest on the coming Messiah (Isaiah 11:1-2, 61:1-3), and second that he will be poured out on his people (Isaiah 44:3; Ezekiel 36:26-28; Joel 2:28-32). These promises are fulfilled in the New Testament, where we see the Holy Spirit descend upon Jesus and guide him (Matthew 3:16, 4:1; Luke 4:16-21), and we see the Spirit poured out on God’s people (Acts 2:1-4, 38-39). And we today are still living out the fulfilment of that promise as he resides within us, having renewed our hearts he continually sanctifying us.

HOME GROUP STUDY 1

This term our Home Group studies aim to straddle the sermons we hear in church. Each week we'll reflect on what we heard on Sunday in the *Letting it Settle* section, and then we'll think forward toward the next topic in the *Explore* section. For this week, though, we'll set the foundation for the rest of the series by sharing our understanding of the Holy Spirit, and exploring what it means that he gives us new birth and dwells within us!

Getting Started

Share your understanding of the Holy Spirit. How do you think he relates to the Father, the Son and to us? (See Matthew 3:16-17).

What questions about the Holy Spirit do you hope to address through this series?

Explore - New Birth by the Holy Spirit

Read: John 3:1-8

Jesus tells Nicodemus that to enter the kingdom of God a person must be born again, or born of water and the Spirit. What do you think this means? (See also Titus 3:4-7).

How often do you think about the fact that you've been born again by the Spirit? How often should we think about it?

Read Ephesians 1:13-14

Paul says the Holy Spirit is a “seal” and “deposit”, marking those who have faith. What do you think this means?

Based on this, how do you think we can know whether we've received the Spirit as a deposit? (See also Romans 10:9-10).

What do the verses we've looked at in this study teach us about the Holy Spirit? What part does he play in our salvation?

HOME GROUP STUDY 2

Letting it Settle - New Birth by the Holy Spirit

Share your thoughts on the sermon from Sunday. What stood out to you?

If you're a Christian then you've been given new birth by the Holy Spirit and he resides within you! How does knowing this affect the way you see yourself and other Christians? (See 1 Corinthians 6:19-20).

Where have you felt the Holy Spirit prompting you to grow or change as you live life according to your new birth?

Explore - Eyes Opened by the Holy Spirit

Have you ever experienced a moment where “the lights came on” for you? Share what happened.

Read Ephesians 1:13-20

How do these verses describe what the Holy Spirit does for us?

In what ways do you think the Spirit enlightens us to the truth about God and about us?

Read 1 Corinthians 2:9-16

What differences are there between someone with the Holy Spirit, and someone without?

How does having the Holy Spirit help us navigate the choices and decisions we're faced with?

HOME GROUP STUDY 3

Letting it Settle - Eyes Opened by the Holy Spirit

What's something you learned from the last sermon? What impact did it have on your understanding of the Holy Spirit?

How should we respond to having our eyes opened to the truths of the Bible through the Holy Spirit?

How can you discern whether the Spirit is guiding you in a particular direction? Share how he has been guiding you lately.

Explore - Fighting Sin in the Spirit's Power

Have you ever broken a habit? Why did you decide to, and how did you do it?

Read Romans 8:1-13

What's the connection between Jesus, the Holy Spirit, and us in verses 1-4?

Verses 5-13 describe two ways to live. What are they and what are the differences between them?

Read Colossians 3:1-11

What reasoning does Paul give for the dramatic change he urges in believers?

The Holy Spirit works in us to put off these practices. Share how he's helped you put sin to death up to now, and confess together the areas of your life that still need to change.

Read Colossians 3:12-17

How do these verses describe our relationship with God as those he has changed through the Holy Spirit?

What does this mean for the life we now live and call each other to live?

Read Galatians 5:16-26

What do you think Paul means by “the fruit of the Spirit”?

Have you noticed God changing you in this way? What’s one area in particular you know God wants you to keep growing in?

It's human nature to compare ourselves with one another. How does this passage reshape that instinct into an attitude that honours God over self? (See also 1 Corinthians 13:1-3)

How do you think the Spirit has gifted you? How can you best use your particular gifts in faith and love?

What do you think it means for us to have “the firstfruits of the Spirit”?

Paul says the Spirit intercedes for us. Does this mean we don’t need to pray? How do you think we should understand the role of the Holy Spirit in our prayer life?
